Kathy Chambliss: Called the meeting to order at 1:00 PM. Welcome all members and guests. Karletta Pruszynski: There were 52 members and 11 guests present. Our membership total is now 93. There were 809.5 service hours recorded for the month bringing our yearly total to 4794 hrs.

No changes or corrections were made to the May minutes and treasurer's reports; both will be filed for audit.

Changes to Bylaws: the proposed changes to the bylaws were published last month to add a new Education Officer to the board. The changes were approved by a majority show of hand vote.

Carol Surrells – The Treasurer's report is listed in the newsletter. The "McKinney Bright Lights" raffle quilt made \$1515; funds disbursed equally to 3 local charities. The board is open to suggestions as to where the funds from the "Garden Party" quilt proceeds will be distributed. The De-Stash Sale made \$1436.73.

Jean Ann Clarke-leftover patterns from the De-Stash Sale are spread across the stage; free for the taking, donations welcome.

Gisele Oakes – the board has approved supporting the organization Direction 61:3, the local program that helps young adults that have aged out of the foster system have a place and time to get prepared to live on their own. If anyone has completed (or tops that need to be finished) twins size quilts (and pillowcases to go with them would be nice), the organization currently has 9 girls in the program that would be blessed with the gift of a quilt of their own.

Suzan Crocker – Stitchin' Heaven Retreat, Sept 27- Oct 1, cost is \$425. Forms available to reserve a spot, a wait list will be created.


Sara Lindsay's husband George's cancer has returned and he's not pursuing treatment.



Our Block of the Month Program

This year we are using red, white, and blue fabric blocks (one or more) to make tops for our Veterans program. There will be 9 different star block patterns. Instructions for each block will appear monthly in the newsletter and instructions for all 9 blocks will



be on our website.

Current block tally: Jan - 14; Feb - 13; March - 12; April - 10; May - 9; June -11

July Block of the Month: Disappearing Hourglass Star

This block may look difficult but if you follow each step closely and sew your seams a consistent ¼", it is really quite easy to make. And rows of blocks make a wonderful 2-fabric (or multi-fabric) quilt. Have fun with it!

Fabric needed: Two 10 ½" squares, one either red or blue and one white.

Match the squares with right sides facing. Sew down each side, using a 1/4" seam allowance.

Cut the sewn square diagonally both ways to make four half-square triangles.

Press the HST open with the colored fabric on top. Trim the dog ears to eliminate bulk.

Fig 1: Arrange the 4 half-square triangles alternating light and dark to the center, as shown below, to make an hourglass block. Sew into 2 rows and press the seams toward the darker triangle. Sew the two rows together to complete the block. Press. Your hourglass block should measure 13 ½", trim if needed.

- Fig 2: Cut the block into thirds, each way, each third should measure 4 ½".
- Fig 3: Turn each of the eight outside squares 180°
- Fig 4: Turn the center block 90°.
- Fog 5: Sew rows together nesting seams. You may want to repress the seams that intersect with the center square to nest them.
