## What is the Block of the Month Program?

Members are asked to make a block according to each month's instructions. There will be a different star-themed quilt block each month, January through September. Please make one block to donate to the guild using red, white, and blue fabric. In November we put together the donated blocks to make tops for our Veterans program. The instructions for each block will be in the monthly newsletter and instructions for all 9 blocks will be on our website. I'm hoping we will have enough blocks to make 10 tops.

## March Block of the Month: Night Time Star

## Unfinished Block size 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " X 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (12" finished)

The March Block of the Month is basically the same as February's BOM with placement changes. Turning the outside Half Square Triangles (HST) gives the Night Time Star block a different look from February's LeMoyne Star.

The basic building squares in this pattern are HST. A good resource for making HST can be found at: <a href="http://www.blog.treasurie.com/half-square-triangles/">www.blog.treasurie.com/half-square-triangles/</a>

#### Fabric needed:

Background: Twelve 3 1/2" squares to make four corner squares & eight HST

Star color 1: eight 3 1⁄2" squares for HST

Star color 2: eight 3 ½" squares for HST

Make the following HST combinations:

Four HST color 1 & background

Four HST color 2 & background

Four HST color 1 and color 2

Hint: make sure your HST's measure an accurate 3 ½" square for easier piecing.

Arrange your squares as shown and sew together.

## De-Stash Your Stash Sale -May Meeting Roll larger pieces and tie with curling ribbon. Smaller pieces in Ziploc bags. Use name tag stickers or paper attached to cloth to identify - price color sticker in dollar increments, yardage, or inches. (Please make sure your donation is usable-large enough to add to a quilt- many fat quarters or larger etc.) Color code can be by <u>sticker</u> or crayon/marker on paper attached to fabric. If using tape, please do not use one that will leave a sticky residue such as packing tape. Green \$1.00 Blue \$2.00 Yellow \$3.00 Pink \$4.00 Red \$5.00 White for more than \$5.00 Write in your price. Pick up your items if they do not sell and you want to keep them. If left, they will be donated to charities. No magazines but books ok. Patterns for quilts ok but not for clothes. You can sell buttons, seam binding, thread, rickrack etc. Put in a baggie and mark as above. The proceeds from the sale will go directly to the guild-not individuals. Jean Ann Clarke, Chairperson

In case you missed last month's newsletter, our total for 2022 was a whopping 546!


Thank you MQG quilters for your hard work!
