Use name tag stickers or paper attached to cloth to identify - price color sticker in dollar increments, yardage, or inches. (Please make sure your donation is usable-large enough to add to a quilt- many fat quarters or larger etc.) Color code can be by <u>sticker</u> or crayon/marker on paper attached to fabric. If using tape, please do not use one that will leave a sticky residue such as pack-

ing tape.

Green \$1.00 Blue \$2.00 Yellow \$3.00 for more than \$5.00 Write in your price. Pink \$4.00 Red \$5.00 White

Pick up your items if they do not sell and you want to keep them. If left, they will be donated to charities.

No magazines but books ok. Patterns for guilts ok but not for clothes. You can sell buttons, seam binding, thread, rickrack etc. Put in a baggie and mark as above.

Our Block of the Month Program

Please join us in making red, white, and blue fabric blocks (one or more) to donate to the guild to make tops for our Veterans program. There will be 9 different star block patterns. Instructions for each block will appear monthly in the newsletter and instructions for all 9 blocks will be on our website. Current tally: Jan – 9; Feb – 11; March – 8; April 3.

May Block of the Month: Indian Star

The Indian Star quilt block is a wonderful way to introduce the popular flying geese pattern.

Unfinished Block size 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " X 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (12" finished)

Fabric needed: background, one red and one blue fabric.

Background: Four squares 3 1/2", One square 7 1/4" bisect on diagonal both ways

Red: four squares 3 7/8" and bisect on one diagonal for flying geese.

Blue: four squares 3 ½"; two for center four patch and 2 for right top and bottom left corners.

Using blue and background fabric, make 1 four-patch for the center.

Using red and background fabric, make four flying geese. There is a great online tutorial showing 5 different ways to make flying geese blocks:

https://kristinesser.com/2018/07/12/how-to-make-a-flying-geese-block-5-different-ways/

If you do not want to make flying geese blocks, you can use 3 ½" squares to make 8 HST using red & background fabrics.

Layout blocks as shown and sew together.

Check out the quilts below when Indian Star blocks are combined. Happy sewing, Roxy

the donated gift card, you might try to offer it to another member who lives closer to the shop. And always thank the Quilt Shops for their generous gifts to our Guild.





RED BOOT RETREAT Recap & Spring Retreat 2024


