McKinney Quilters Guild Minutes of August 17, 2021

The meeting of McKinney Quilters Guild was called to order on August 17, 2021, by Lillian Hughes, President, at 1:07 PM. There were no corrections to the minutes or Treasurer's Report of June, 2021, and they stand approved as printed in the August newsletter, and will be filed for audit. Lillian announced that all current officers have agreed to serve for another year, with Kathy Chambliss agreeing to be President. The slate will be presented at the October meeting, voting will be at the November meeting, with open nominations from the floor.

Membership – Elaine Henry reports there are 27 members with 1 visitor today.

Heard-Craig Community Project – Vilda Caudill accepted more walker bags for this project, she estimates that the Guild made 43.

Denison Retreat – Julie Rushin has the forms for the retreat to be held September 16 to 19, 2021, in Denison. She has 39 people enrolled, it's not too late if you're interested. The charity this event is supporting is Grayson County Crisis Center and she has a list of items they are requesting.

History Block of the Month – Carolyn Miller had two vintage quilts, both named *Wild Goose Chase*, both from the turn of the century, probably both from Pennsylvania, as they are blue, yellow and orange in color. Carolyn is going to have an exhibit of quilts at the Texas Quilt Museum in LaGrange, TX, September 23 to October 9, 2021. She will give a lecture on October 2nd.

Mini Madness – Carol Surrells announced that the sale will be postponed until 2022, looking for a venue to hold this event.

Operation Quilted Comfort – Sharon Wilhelm has kits to pick up. These are quilts for Veterans and she is always accepting patriotic fabric for quilts, pillowcases and laundry bags. She will have a cutting session after the Plano Quilt Show.

I dabble in embroidery, stay as far away as possible from applique and I am frightened to try wool for fear I will love it and add yet another set of UFOs to my unending pile. I love going to quilt shows and admiring all the beautiful quilts, and of course then there are the vendors who whisper my name! At one time in my life, I was really into making stain glass. It just isn't a hobby that you can pick up and work on for a few minutes in front of the TV though. I'm a huge reader but since the great grandbabies have come, I find that most of my time is spent with them. I'm in a couple of small groups. Maybe we could look into donating quilts to the McKinney battered women's shelter that someone talked about. I don't remember the name. Let me know.




