Block of the Month March: Spring Flowers

It's not too early to think about Spring flowers. They brighten our world after the cold of winter. This block contains three flowers in a vertical block pattern.

Fabric needed for **each** flower: Background: Three 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares; two 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares; 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Green: one 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square (leaves). Red: one 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square and one 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Yellow: one 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square.

Make two HST for leaf blocks.

Align one green square and one white square right-sides together. Draw a diagonal line and sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on both sides Cut on diagonal line, trim to 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", press.

Make two HST for tulip petals.

Align one red square and one white square right-sides together. Draw a diagonal line and sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on both sides Cut on diagonal line, trim to 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", press. You will need the 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square to complete the flower (see below).

Make tulip center block.

Sew two white $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " square together. Sew one yellow and one white $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " square together. Sew white unit above yellow/white unit as shown below.

Sew the squares together as shown below to make one $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " flower block. Make two more flower blocks: the same colors or vary the colors.

Sew three flowers together vertically. The block should measure 6 ¹/₂" x 18 ¹/₂".





Sew a 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " background strip to the top and bottom of the block. Sew a 2" x 20 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strip to the left side of the block. Sew a 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 20 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strip to the right side of the block.

February Block of the Month Additional Instructions

Apologies from Roxy. These instructions were left off the print out last month. Before you sew the two halves of the hearts together: Sew a 2" x 2" square to the top right corner of the left side of the heart. Trim and press. Sew a 2" x 2" square to the top left corner of the right side of the heart. Trim and press. Now sew the two sides together vertically to form the heart.






