Leo Ransom Workshop "The Art of Fabric Portraiture"

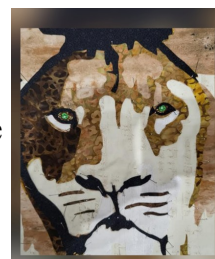
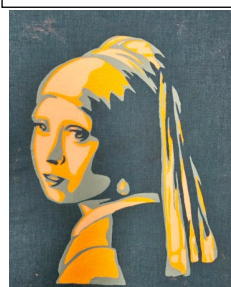
This will be a full day workshop where you will learn the technique of layering fabrics with a cut away process. Leo is offering 14 different patterns to choose from.
