

Block of the Month 2024

Fahric Needed

The Block of the Month for 2024 will be a mystery quilt. It is designed to be a patriotic quilt using red, white, and blue but feel free to choose your own color palette. The fabric needed specifications are if you follow the instructions given each month. You can alter the fabric colors, make it scrappy or change any of the designs to one you prefer. This will, of course, affect the fabric needed.

I happen to have a Wilmington patriotic layer cake and used about half of it, along with some fabric in my stash, to complete the quilt. One caution, you will need a 2 ½" x WOF in both red and white.

The finished quilt will measure 46.5" x 48". You can alter the last row to larger blocks if you wish to make a bigger quilt. Just remember to include those blocks in the fabric requirements.

You will be making the blocks and then putting them together to make the quilt top.

Fabrics Needed:

Background (light) 1-2/3 yd, Red 3/4 yd, Blue 1/2 yard, Dark Blue FQ, White 1/4 yard Green FQ, Yellow FQ, Brown F8. Scraps will work for these colors.

I hope you enjoy making this quilt. Your participation is much appreciated for our Veterans program. Happy Sewing, Roxy


Quilting Demonstration

January 2024 Program -Suzi Parron is our January speaker.



Her program which will be by zoom is about Barn Quilts and the American Quilt Trails. Through dozens of interviews with barn artists, committee members, and barn owners Parron documents a journey that began in 2001 with the founder of the movement, Donna Sue Groves. Groves's desire to honor her mother with a quilt square painted on their barn became a group effort that eventually grew into a county-wide project. Today, registered quilt squares form a long imaginary clothesline, appearing on more than three thousand barns scattered along one hundred driving trails.

Look through your stash of quilt magazines and books for inspiration. Use this method cautiously, though; it might set you off on a tangent that will get you started on yet another project before you've finished the one at hand.

Fun! Fun! Pun! Quick & Casy Pillowcase

These instructions are for one standard size pillow (approximately 32" x 20")

Fabric Requirement:

Main fabric (body) of pillowcase - 3/4 yard

Cuff of pillowcase - 1/4 yard

Accent strip - 1/8 yard


Instructions:

- 1. Trim the 1/8 yard of fabric to 2" width. Fold the accent in half lengthwise, wrong sides together and press.
- 2. Trim to even the long edges of the cuff. Lay the cuff fabric right side up with selvages going down the side. Place accent strip on cuff with raw edges even on upper long side. (See Drawing #1)

 Lay the main fabric right side down and line up the raw edges along the top. (Drawing #1)
- 3. From the opposite end, (or bottom) roll the edges of the main fabric until the cuff shows. (Drawing #2)
- 4. Bring up the bottom cuff raw edge, aligning with the top edges and enclosing rolled up main fabric. Pin in place. This will form a tube.
- 5. Stitch across the pinned seam.
- 6. Reach inside the tube and pull out the main fabric. Press. Trim excess fabric along side.

For beautifully finished seams:

- 7. Turn right side out and stitch a scant 1/4" seam across bottom (opposite cuff) and down the side.
- 8. Turn wrong side out and stitch a 1/2" seam along bottom and side.
